



Council Workshop – Walking Audit Case Study: Elma Street South and Alice Street West



July 5, 2017 1:00PM

The Town of the Blue Mountains' Council (the Council) is in the process of completing workshops to determine the Level of Service of municipal infrastructure within local and collector road allowances. To facilitate this discussion, Council will take part in a walking audit as part of a Special Meeting of Council. It was determined that Elma Street South and Alice Street West would be used as the case study area.

This area includes a number of different design cross sections representative of other areas within the community. Council will use the area to narrow down issues and review solutions that could be applied throughout the Town. No final decisions will be made regarding the area until the public is consulted.

Through the design process for the Elma and Alice Street Reconstruction Project, the public, particularly the residents on the streets, will be consulted during a community meeting that will be held in the late summer or early fall. Questions and discussion will be received at the community meeting specific to the Elma and Alice Street Reconstruction Project.
