A. Call to Order

Mayor John McKean called the meeting to order with all members of Council present, save Deputy Mayor Gail Ardiel absent due to vacation.

Also present, Interim CAO Shawn Everitt, Director of Finance and IT Services Ruth Prince, Director of Planning and Development Services Michael Benner, Director of Infrastructure & Public Works Reg Russwurm, Director of Enforcement Services/Fire Chief Rob Collins, Manager of Solid Waste and Environmental Initiatives Jeff Fletcher, Manager of Building/CBO Greg Miller, Acting Director of Community Services Ryan Gibbons, Manager of Water & Wastewater Allison Kershaw, Construction Coordinator Mike Campbell,

Council then paused for a Moment of Reflection

Council then recognized the recipients of the Town's New Environmental Sustainability Fund, Free Spirit Gardens (lead applicant: Kimberly Edwards) and Blue Mountain Watershed Trust Foundation (lead applicant: Blanka Guyatt). Mayor McKean noted that the annual fund has \$5000 to distribute to not for profit groups that make application for local projects that work towards environmental sustainability.

Mayor McKean noted that The Blue Mountain Watershed Trust Foundation will focus on natural systems learning in local elementary schools, including Beaver Valley Community School.

Mayor McKean noted that Free Spirit Gardens will put funding towards the Thornbury Community Gardens project, including the purchase of a tool shed for the garden located at the Beaver Valley Community Centre. Funds will help Free Spirit Gardens conduct 5 community workshops and 6 school workshops centred around the new community garden that will have 20 rental plots, a food bank plot, a school plot, and a communal edible and pollinator perimeter garden.

Mayor McKean noted under the authority of the *Municipal Act, 2001* and in accordance with Ontario's *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (MFIPPA), The Corporation of the Town of The Blue Mountains wishes to inform the public that all information including opinions, presentations, reports and documentation provided for or at a Public Meeting, Public Consultation, or other Public Process are considered part of the public record. B.1 Deputation: Savanna Myers, Grey County Economic Development Manager, Re: Grey County Economic Development – Municipal Update

Savanna Myers spoke introducing the Grey County Economic Development team present. Savanna noted that all nine municipalities in Grey County are part of the team as well, noting that municipalities support businesses as well. Savanna noted that the Grey County Economic Development team works with the Town's Communications and Economic Development Coordinator, Elizabeth Cornish.

Savanna spoke regarding their Strategic Direction and 2017 Initiatives. Savannah spoke regarding the Top 7 Intelligent Communities, noting that SWIFT is very important for Grey County.

Savanna noted that labour is a reality in Grey County, and noted that there is a 4.4% unemployment rate in Grey County, which is basically full employment. Savanna noted that attainable housing is an issue and an economic barrier. Savanna noted that there is currently a baby-boom in Grey County, and that childcare spaces are needed. Savanna noted that the County is developing a map that will identify where childcare spaces are available.

Savanna noted that apples, sheep and hay are leading export items from Grey County.

Savanna spoke regarding their 2018 priorities, including business retention, local priorities and actions. Savanna noted that we need to do a better job at retaining people here in Grey County.

Mayor McKean thanked Savanna and the Grey County Economic Development team for their presentation.

Todd Savill spoke on behalf of the Interested Citizen Group of Elma Street and Alice Street. Todd noted that they are asking Council to direct staff to consult fully with the residents of Elma and Alice Streets and to receive and consider the suggestions and recommendations of residents for the reconstruction process of Alice and Elma Streets.

Council will be required to see staff in advance of the Council meeting to view the "clean" copy of the accounts and invoices statement to determine if they are required to declare a conflict under the Municipal Conflict of Interest Act. Failure to declare a conflict could lead to other Municipal Conflict of Interest issues to arise."
